We are aware that Divi is currently not fully WCAG/ADA compliant and it's something we have a bug report open and a full feature in order to fix the accessibility problems. I don't have any ETA at the moment, as a lot of our resources are targeted to Divi 5, which will allow us to release new features and functionality considerably faster, including accessibility.

Hope this helps, we are definitely taking accessibility seriously and have in plan to make our products more accessible, including the areas pointed out in the above testings.
